#### Key aims for 2016-2017

- To build upon and develop level of participation in competitions in school (additional to PE lessons), inter school events and expand to a wider range of community clubs
- Ensure that all pupils are participating in at least 3 hours of physical activity a week and develop the range of clubs available. New EYFS/KS1 lunchtime club and after school club, the latter looking to offer exam level training.
- Increase number attending Running Club which is x3 a week at lunchtime and encourage community members to support.
- Improve the sports provision within the school by continuing to increase CPD for teaching staff and specialist coaching.
- Ensure that all pupils in KS2, KS1 and EYFS participate in taster sessions to experience a new activity. Opportunity for parents to experience, with their child, the taster experience.
- Continue to monitor and evaluate coaching and teaching.
- Teachers to develop lesson study initiative
- Develop Sports Leaders (in each year group) and formalise the role of Sports Captains
- To apply for the Schools Games Mark in recognition of the development of PE within the school

#### Focus for Sports Premium Funding 2016-2017

- Funding of specialist PE Coaching that will help children progress and boost excellence.
- Continued professional development of staff through the observation of specialist coaches and specialist courses that lead to coaching awards
- Payment of transport and other costs to enable children to attend sports festivals and competitions. Especially to inter school competitions.
- Development of Sports Leaders

### The measured impact of Sports Premium

- 100% of children at Key Stages 1 & 2 attended a FREE sports club
- Majority of KS1 & 2 pupils took part in inter school competitive games.
- School participating in more sports competitions, including Tag Rugby Competitions, KS2 Rural Netball and Football Competitions, Kwik Cricket, Cross Country, Mini-Tennis, Multi-Sports, School Games events, inter school events and KS1 festivals .
- PE funding helped to pay for transport costs to the above activities, supply cover and match costs as well as membership to lead bodies.
- Continued increase of teachers' confidence in delivering a range of sports lessons. CPD for new staff to support the delivery of high quality PE; PE coordinator & class teachers worked together to plan and deliver a diverse Physical Education curriculum, thus ensuring high quality PE lessons. Assistant Head teacher attended Headteachers' Conference for an update on Sports Premium Funding
- Increase in newsletter articles and Twitter posts for parents and community with a sports theme – appreciated by parents. Increased parental support at sporting events mirrors the increase in pupils attending competitions.
- Improved health and fitness of children. Nearly all children took part in a sports club/after school activity during the year and fewer children missing PE.
- PE Equipment audited 2016 and replaced as needed including replacement and new PE and Sports kit. Staff aware of new equipment. Increase in KS2 equipment to promote greater participation in lessons.
